

## FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD - Weekend of FEBRUARY 1 &~2

Since the fourth century, the church has celebrated "The Presentation of the Lord" when, in accordance with Jewish Law, Joseph and Mary presented their firstborn male son to the Temple Priest 40 days following his birth.

During the 11<sup>th</sup>Century, the church began the custom of blessing candles prior to the entrance procession culminating in a candle lit procession into a darkened sanctuary while joyously singing the Canticle of Simeon. It is also customary in the Catholic Church to bless infants and their mothers for the Feast of the Presentation.

Our Lady of Fatima Parish will be Celebrating the Feast of the Presentation at all Masses the weekend of February 1 & 2 and all are encouraged to attend!

## PROPERS - SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME PRESCRIBED ANTIPHONS

The "Propers" are assigned Antiphons from the Roman Missal which are to accompany each of the three processions which occur during Mass: the Entrance Procession (Introit), the Presentation of the Gifts Procession (Offertory Proper) and the Communion Procession ("Communio"). The texts are taken directly from sacred scripture; most often from the Book of Psalms. Like the Readings, these Antiphons are assigned to each Liturgical Celebration.

**INTROIT:** OMNIS TERRA ADORET TE

Let all the earth praise You, O God!

OFFERTORY PROPER JUBILATE DEO, UNIVERSA TERRA

O be joyful in God all ye lands!

"COMMUNIO": LAETAMIBUR...

We shall rejoice in Your Salvation.

#### ENTRANCE ANTIPHON (INTROIT)

Recently, one of Organ Catholic Press's most notable contemporary music composer/arrangers, Ken Canedo, (spiritandsong.com) recommended that the Catholic Church's sing the prescribed Entrance Antiphon from the Roman Missal and/or the Graduale Romanum during the entrance procession of Mass rather than substituting a Hymn or song as has become common practice (citing the General Instruction for the Roman Missal):

"Since the 1960's, many if not most English speaking assemblies have been doing [the] fourth option almost exclusively. It's time for us to realize that there are other options in the New Roman Missal, including...[singing] the prescribed Entrance Antiphon. But during the time of transition, pastorally speaking, our choirs and assemblies need to be educated more in liturgical principles. Also, contemporary composers need to compose more settings for the prescribed Entrance and Communion Antiphons."

NEW MASS SETTING Our Lady of Fatima Parish will be introducing a beautiful new Mass Setting this weekend. The Mass setting is arranged by Dominican Priest, the Reverend Michael O'Connor, and is based upon a setting of the "GLORIA" by famous composer Richard Proulx. #### 50th ANNIVERSARY OF VATICAN II

The Mass of Vatican II (abridged)

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concilium), was issued by the Second Vatican Council in 1963. It is one of the most important documents of the Council, one that has been the least understood and, I believe, has wrought the most havoc - not by having been fulfilled - but by having been ignored or misinterpreted.

The Council actually spells out its intent, in paragraph 14: "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations, which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy." The key words here are "full, conscious, and active participation." The Latin for "active participation" is actuosa participatio.

I researched previous uses of that expression in papal and ecclesial documents the first usage was in 1903 by Pope St. Pius X, who considered himself a pope of renewal. He issued one of the first documents of his pontificate called *Tra Le Solicitudini*, that is, "Among the Concerns" concerning the renewal of sacred music. In it, the Holy Father states, *'In order that the faithful may more actively participate in the sacred liturgy, let them be once again made to sing Gregorian Chant as a congregation."* 

That's what the term "active participation" meant when first used in a papal document. The first use of *actuosa participatio*, i.e., active participation, referred explicitly and exclusively to the restoration of the congregational singing of Gregorian Chant. In 1928, Pope Pius XI reiterated the point in his Apostolic Letter, *Divini Cultus*. Nineteen years after that, in the *Magna Carta* of liturgical reform, *Mediator Dei*, issued by Pius XII, the same term was used with the same meaning. So until the Second Vatican Council, the term "active participation" referred exclusively to the singing of Gregorian Chant by the people.
