PARISH VISION AND PLANNING UPDATE

Our Lady of Fatima Parish has a parish council made up of members of our parish and our Pastor, Fr. Phil. The vision of the parish council is "to serve our parish by supporting our Pastor." The purpose of the council is "to act as a consultative body to our Pastor."

Through pastoral planning, the pastoral council assists our pastor in developing and living out the mission of our parish; forming community as a sign and witness of unity for our larger parish community; providing recommendations for parish priorities, directions, and policies; and promoting communication and understanding among parish organizations and between the parish, the Archdiocese, and the universal Church.

In 2015, the pastoral council surveyed our parishioners to get information for visioning and future planning. A large amount of data was collected and used as a foundation to define the parish long-range priorities and goals. Then, in 2016, with the help of the Archdiocese the parish council developed a <u>five-year plan</u>.

Three teams were formed to drive these goals, organized around the three priorities that were identified for our parish abbreviated as: Faith, Community and Service.

Since then, these teams, under the strong leadership of their volunteer leaders, have executed the vision and made significant progress towards the parish goals.

Parishioners were emailed a link to a new survey on May 1st to help the parish council determine how we are doing so far in meeting the goals of the pastoral plan at this third-year junction. Please complete your survey by May 15th.

Since purchasing our new hymnal *Ritual Song*, many have wandered away, around 40 copies actually.


If you know to where they wandered could you


ST. VINCENT DE PAUL: Use your envelope or place your check in an envelope marked "St. VdeP" in the Sunday collection to help local neighbors.

At the time of his retirement in 1996, General Barry McCaffrey was the most decorated and youngest 4-star General serving in the United States Army. During his 4 combat tours, he earned 3 Purple Heart Medals, 2 Distinguished Service Crosses, and 2 Silver Stars. His leadership of the left hook attack into Iraq during Operation Desert Storm etched him into the public's mind.

By the end of his military career he led 84,000 military personnel as commander-in chief of the U.S. Southern Command.

After his military career, McCaffrey went on to counsel Presidents and Secretaries of States on both military and drug policy. George Bush relied on his advice during the Salt 11 treaty negotiations in Moscow. Clinton relied on his drug policy expertise as Director, Office of National Drug Control Policy.

Currently, McCaffrey serves as a national security and terrorism analyst for NBC News and MSNBC. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and an Associate of the Inter-American Dialogue. McCaffrey has been featured in over 15,000 newspaper articles and 8,000 television programs including some of the nation's most prestigious such as Meet the Press, This Week with George Stephanopoulos and Fox News Sunday.

General McCaffrey lives in Magnolia with his wife Jill. He has three married adult children and 6 grand children.
