We simply do not have the funds needed to adequately respond to all the requests for assistance. We have recently received multiple ones for rent, utilities, and food.



SACRED HEART FOOD BANK:

My name and preferred address is Father Freitag (pronounced Free-tag). Yes, I know it's German for Friday. My ancestors emigrated from Bavaria in the mid-1800s and decided to Americanize it rather than change the spelling. Life would have been so much easier if they had.

Born and raised in Seattle, I have four sisters, three brothers, and numerous nieces and nephews. I attended Our Lady of Fatima grade school ('76), Queen Anne High School ('80), and Gonzaga University ('84). After college, I worked as an auditor for the accounting firm, Touche Ross. Two years later, I left to attend the University of South Carolina where I obtained a Masters in International Business ('88). I then returned home to administrate Kenworth and Peterbilt truck sales in the Pacific Rim for PACCAR International.



After much prayerful discernment, I left PACCAR in 1991 to enter the pre-theology program at the Seminary of Christ the King in Mission, BC. I then attended Mundelein Seminary north of Chicago for four years of theological and pastoral formation. On June 8, 1996, Archbishop Murphy ordained me to the priesthood at St. James Cathedral.

For my first two assignments, I served as a parochial vicar: one year at St. Mary Magdalene, Everett, and two years at Sacred Heart and Assumption, Bellingham. In 1999, Archbishop Brunett named me pastor of Our Lady Star of the Sea, Bremerton, where I served for nine years. He then assigned me to St. Monica, Mercer Island, as pastor for thirteen years. Emerging from the pandemic in 2021, Archbishop Etienne ask me to serve as regional pastor for all seven faith communities of Grays Harbor County. When I returned from a sabbatical last year, the Archbishop asked me to serve as a mentor and spiritual director for priests across the archdiocese while assisting at the parishes of St. Jude, Redmond, and Holy Innocents, Duvall, prior to the launch of Partners in the Gospel.

I am very excited to be returning home to Magnolia and Queen Anne after so many years away. Much is still the same but most of the faces, names, and stories will be new! Wherever I may be found on a given day, you may see a Golden Retriever at my side. That would be my companion in ministry, Maggie. She is almost two years old and still very much a puppy. Other than being with me, her greatest pleasures are meeting people and exploring with her nose.


Now that you know something about me, I look forward to learning something about you as we walk together the path of grace in the company of our savior Jesus, his mother, Mary, and grandmother, Anne.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

My name is Dominic Bao Quoc Tran, and I am a Redemptorist priest. I am a native of Vietnam, where I am the seventh of twelve children. Our family immigrated to Montreal, Quebec, Canada, in 1980. In 1987, after completing my priestly formation at the Montreal seminary, I joined the Redemptorist Congregation in California. I was ordained as a priest in Los Angeles, California, on July 28th, 1990, and have remained in priestly ministry in the USA since then.





One of the most significant chapters of my priestly ministry was the seven years I spent on a mission in Vietnam (from 2005 to 2012), where I had the privilege of teaching moral theology to seminarians and future priests. I also worked closely with the Redemptorists in Vietnam, collaborating in various missionary endeavors and engaging in different socio-pastoral ministries for the destitute. These years of mission work abroad significantly enriched my spiritual life and priestly ministry.

Returning to Seattle in September 2023 feels like a homecoming for me. Previously, I served as a parochial vicar at Sacred Heart of Jesus's former parish. Now, I am honored to be called to serve our parish family, which includes Our Lady of Fatima, Saint Anne, and Sacred Heart of Jesus. It's a special blessing for which I am deeply grateful.

I look forward to meeting you, getting to know you, and sharing our wonderful journey of faith together as a big family.
